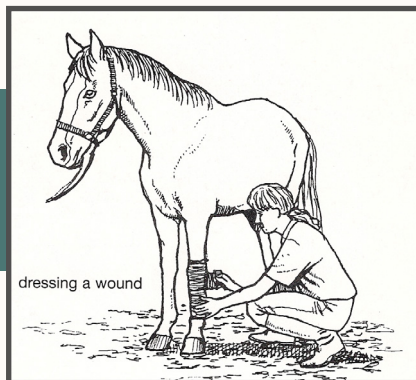

- Track Veterinarian



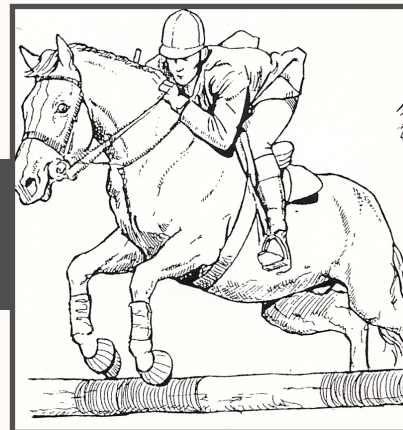

If you know a horseman and would like to do the same type of work, ask them what they did to prepare for their job.

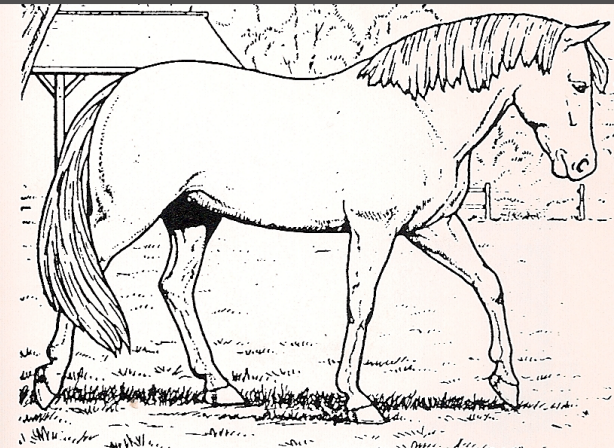


New York State Horse Council as well as many of its chapters offer Equine Scholarships. Other equine groups and even some schools offer scholarships as well. Start your search as soon as possible!

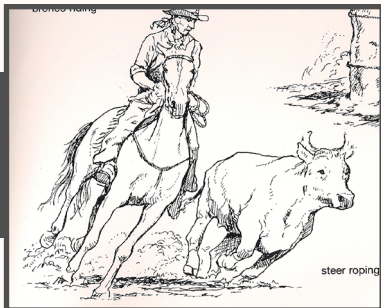


Where Would You Like To Work?

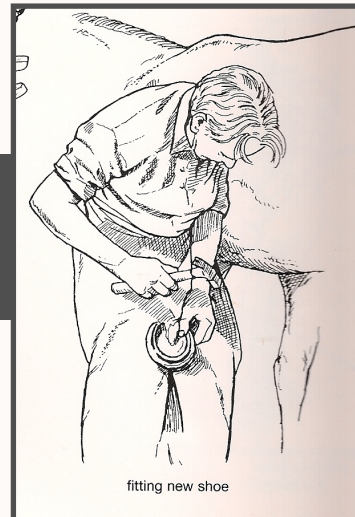
If You Have a High School Education, You Might Consider Some Of These Jobs:
